Why are CCSA costs low?

CCSA is subsidized by an industry levy administered by the WCB, so our services are free or very affordable. But that's not the only reason to use our services. Everything we do is geared specifically for continuing care. We get you — and that's the number one reason to work with us!



How can I reduce my WCB premiums?

Become COR certified! A Certificate of Recognition (COR) is awarded to employers who have developed a health and safety program that meets certain standards. CCSA is a certifying body for COR. We also train auditors and provide coaching to help you earn COR certification. After earning a COR, you are eligible for sizeable refunds from WCB. Last year, our COR holders received more than \$1.7M in refunds.



We have in-house health and safety. Do we need CCSA?

There are many ways CCSA can support your existing team. For example, our body mechanics specialist can train your nurse educator, who can then share best practices throughout your organization. If you are preparing for a COR audit, we'll review your package before your submit it. We'll even do a full review of your existing health and safety program to identify any gaps, and share resources to help you address them. Give us a call to learn more.

BECOME AN AUDITOR

Become certified to conduct audits within your organization or externally

There's a sizeable financial benefit to earning a Certificate of Recognition (COR)

Depending on your health and safety record, premiums for the average continuing care provider in Alberta could be as high as \$246,000 or as low as \$43,000 each and every year.

If you are a COR holder, you could pay as little as \$28,000 in premiums the first year.

In 2021, CCSA COR holders received \$1.7M in WCB refunds. That's money in the bank, and the CCSA can help you get there.

It pays to be safe

Once certified, you're eligible for a 10% industry rate refund from WCB for the first year, and 5% every year after you maintain the COR. Learn more here.
