



MENTAL HEALTH AND STRAIN Connectivity and the dissemination of required information was a priority for many healthcare providers. Each province has its legislative and clinical parameters. The sharing of perspectives, tools and training initiatives helped to rapidly react and support the healthcare systems in each province.

Protecting oneself and others while maintaining the presence of healthcare workers required rapid acquisition of knowledge. The sharing across the country of such knowledge quickened the implementation of new protection practices.

Faced with resistance to this protection method, promotion and education, sometimes by comparing with other provinces, helped in the increase of awareness and acceptance.

The procurement, training and adaptation of practices surrounding PPE was one of the greatest challenges, requiring very quick adaptation and production of training material.

The spiraling effect of psychological risks that result in employee absences that increase the pressure on other workers, which in turn heighten the psychological risks to other workers.
